

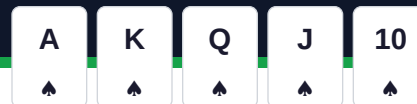
Poker Hand Rankings

From strongest to weakest — your complete reference card

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1

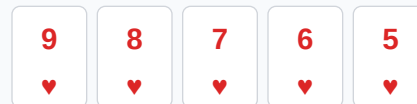
A, K, Q, J, 10 all of the same suit. The best possible hand.



2

Straight Flush

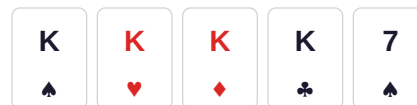
Five consecutive cards of the same suit.



3

Four of a Kind

Four cards of the same rank plus any fifth card.



4

Full House

Three of a kind plus a pair. Ranked by the three, then the pair.

Flush

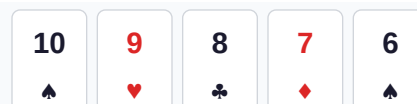
Five cards of the same suit, not in sequence.

Straight

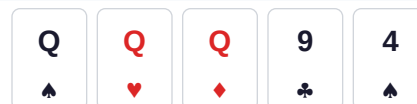
Five consecutive cards of mixed suits. Ace can be high or low.

Three of a Kind

Three cards of the same rank. Also called "trips" or "a set."

Two Pair

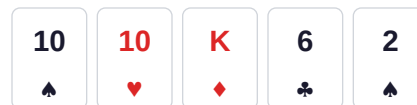
Two different pairs plus a fifth card (the "kicker").

One Pair

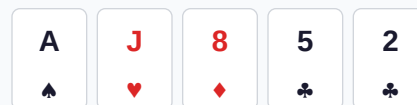
Two cards of the same rank plus three unrelated cards.

High Card

No pair or better. Ranked by the highest card, then next highest.



Quick Memory Aid

Royal Flush > Straight Flush > Quads > Full House > Flush > Straight > Trips > Two Pair > Pair > High Card

A flush always beats a straight. A full house always beats a flush. The "kicker" breaks ties for pairs.
